The Stagnation of the Western Political System

Main points of remarks by

Dr. Hans Köchler.

Professor of Philosophy (Austria), President of the International Progress Organization, on aspects of constitutional theory and political philosophy

- o Definitional issue *I* the democratic paradigm: rule <u>of</u> the people or <u>on behalf</u> of the people?
- o Systemic problems of representation (in view of "democracy" exclusively being defined as a system of *representation*, not of *participation*)
- o *Oligarchy I* lobby rule in the framework of representation, and in particular in the transnational framework
- Alienation of the electorate from office bearers (representatives) in today's globalized environment (with many decisions being made outside the state's democratic constitutional framework)
- o The *democratic deficit* (in particular: legitimation deficit of the European Union as intergovernmental cum transnational structure?)
- o Test cases for European democracy (e.g. migration crisis / coronavirus crisis)
- o Merits of a *hybrid model* of democracy (with participatory and representative procedures) (e.g. the Constitution of the Swiss Confederation)
